SPEAKER | Dr. Matthew Ayre, University of Calgary

ABSTRACT | At 10:20pm on 18th September 1902 during a blinding snowstorm, the veteran Dundee Arctic whaling vessel Nova Zembla struck of reef on a remote coastline high in the Canadian Arctic. Historical climate research using the extant logbooks from this once industrious trade uncovered clues to the location of Nova Zembla?s final resting place. This revelation, along with a little more historical investigation, lead to two improbable Arctic

expeditions and the identification of the first Scottish whaling wreck to be discovered in the Canadian Arctic.

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
